### Impact 2014/2015

Will be completed July 2015

- Pupil trackers identifies progress as 71% improvement in reading(100.94VA) over time, numeracy as 75% (100.54 VA)and Writing as 70% (100.8 VA) for all pupil premium pupils
- Writing Y1-Y6 None Pupil Premium compared to Pupil Premium pupils is in line (no in-school difference)
- Reading Y1-Y6 None Pupil Premium (68%) compared to Pupil Premium pupils (71%) is in line (no in-school difference)
- Numeracy Y1-Y6 None Pupil Premium (68%) compared to Pupil Premium pupils(75%) Pupil Premium outperform non Pupil premium
- Contribution towards educational trips has raised self esteem
- Staff confidently identify pupils with dyslexia issues and ensure effective interventions/support is given (See pupils records)
- Musical instruments have been purchased to widen opportunities for pupils
- Pupils aspirations and self-esteem risen (JI Intervention analysis)
- Opportunities to participate and engage in a range of out of school activities (see PE analysis)
